The African Cultural Foundation Vienna is offering 20–25 young people (aged 18–35) who identify as BIPOC the opportunity to become climate knowledge multipliers as part of the project “Bridging Worlds – BIPOC Women as Climate Knowledge Multipliers.”

Through this programme, you will not only learn from experts in climate justice, activism, and decolonial approaches, but also gain the skills to design and implement your own community-based climate project.

Your idea will be supported both mentorially and financially, allowing you to turn your vision into real impact.

- 4 * €600 (group projects: 2–3 people)
- 2 * €800 (group projects: 2–3 people, more extensive projects)

- YOUNG PEOPLE AGED 18–35
- BASED IN AUSTRIA
- PREFERABLY WOMEN FROM BIPOC COMMUNITIES
- INTEREST IN CLIMATE JUSTICE, COMMUNITY WORK, OR EDUCATION

- APPLICATIONS MUST BE SUBMITTED VIA ONLINE FORM AND INCLUDE:

SKILL BUILDING WORKSHOP

- In addition to the thematic modules, participants will take part in practical workshops led by external experts, including:
 - Educational Methods & Facilitation
 - Storytelling & Communication for Social Impact
 - Digital Tools & Social Media for Advocacy
 - Self-Care & Sustainability in Activism
- These sessions are designed to equip participants with the tools to translate complex climate issues into accessible, community-based learning formats.
- Peer Learning & Community Building
- Participants meet monthly in small peer groups (4–5 people) to:
 - reflect on what they have learned
 - share progress
 - support one another in project development
- This creates a safe, collaborative, and empowering learning environment.
- Community Action Projects (funded)
- Following the learning phase, participants develop and implement their own climate education projects, either individually or in small teams.
